# **First ESPEN Life Long Learning course**

The first European Society for Clinical Nutrition and Metabolism (ESPEN) Life Long Learning (LLL) course was presented in South Africa from 11-13 February 2016. Three events were held in Johannesburg, Cape Town and Pretoria with the theme, "ICU nutrition: treatment and problem solving".

The course was presented by Prof Rémy Meier from Switzerland. Prof Meier is a medical doctor who furthered his training in internal medicine, gastroenterology and clinical nutrition. He is a previous chairman of ESPEN, and currently co-director of the LLL educational programme. The programme consisted of four 30-minute lectures, and the day concluded with an interactive case discussion. This was a great opportunity to engage with an international nutrition expert on the day-to-day challenges faced with regard to the nutritional care of critically ill patients.
