NSSA newsbits

The 25th Congress of the Nutrition Society of South Africa (NSSA) and the 13th Congress of the Association for Dietetics in South Africa will be hosted on 16-19 September 2014 at the Birchwood Hotel and Conference Centre in Johannesburg.

The theme is "Optimal nutrition for all". Dr Jacques Rossouw, chief of the Women's Health Initiative (WHI) branch of the Division of Cardiovascular Sciences at the US National Heart, Lung and Blood Institute is the invited NSSA speaker. Dr Rossouw oversees the WHI study, which addresses the most common causes of death, disability and impaired quality of life in postmenopausal women. The WHI investigates risk factors and tests prevention strategies for heart disease, cancer of the breast and the large bowel, and fractures due to osteoporosis in women. He is well known in South Africa for his work at the South African Medical Research Council, where he was responsible for launching the Coronary Risk Factor Study (CORIS), a community prevention trial. Most of Dr Rossouw's articles and book chapters are on postmenopausal hormone therapy and

cardiovascular disease, lipids, nutrition, and community intervention studies.
